# ELC Council News

**Treasurer's Report** – Offerings and other income for July basically met expenses. We are still \$16,000 below what was budgeted.

**Pastor Tim's Report** – *Pastoral Assistant:* We said thank you and goodbye to our Pastoral Assistant Kira Day. She has done an absolutely wonderful job and great ministry for ELC. She was a great member to have on staff for the last four months and she will be missed.

*Nest Mission (Jean Kim) Feeding Program:* We have begun dialogue with Jean Kim from Nest Mission about possibly partnering with us by using our space for an evening feeding program. The time would consist of approximately running from 3pm-7pm and would include classes for homeless individuals, worship and a community meal. There are many people that need to be involved in talking through this partnership and exploring this possibility.

*Goal Setting/Task Force:* July/August the team has been focusing on doing community interviews. They have been going well and we have been gleaning good information from these. The invitation for the congregation to do interviews with family members or with someone from the community has not had any traction, and we have not received any information or any indication that the congregation is participating in this.

*Confirmation/Youth:* We had a fun hike to celebrate our confirmation time together in the middle of July. We had 4 youth participate in the hike up Mt. Si. It was an incredibly tough hike for the older folks like me but it was a successful outing for the group. They expressed wanting to do something like this again and definitely Whirly Ball, which we did this last year, as a social even for the winter. We talked with the youth about possibly changing the confirmation flow/schedule up a little bit and maybe doing a once a month thing for a longer period of time. This was met with a resounding "NO" and they all expressed how meeting regularly every week was helpful in building relationships and in the learning of the bible topics covered. So we will plan to stick with the same

schedule as last year for confirmation meeting on Wednesdays from 6-7. I also have found a new confirmation curriculum that I think will work very well for the students this year and will have Pastor Julie look at it when she is back to see if she too would like to use it as she also will be teaching confirmation from the curriculum we choose. Also, questions have been asked about having a traditional Sunday morning Sunday School program again, but we do not have a good base of teachers nor regular youth participants to, from my point of view, merit us expending a great deal of energy and coordination on this. However, this fall I am going to invite the families with young children to meet together and talk about doing a monthly "Family Sunday School" to see if we can get buy-in and participation in this approach.

*Liturgical Art Workshop:* We had our liturgical art workshop that was part of the Renewal Grant and led by Anna Montgomery. It was a huge success with about 20 people from the congregation participating and at least 80% of the Wednesday night community participating. The projects worked on will now be woven together by Anna and given to us to hang up and decorate our fellowship hall.

## **Council Business**

*Nest Mission:* Jean Kim presented her program and ideas at the August Council meeting. The Council agreed to convene a smaller group to discuss the request.

*Death of Spouse Support:* The Care and Compassion Team plans to set up a social event in the fall.

*Endowment Committee Update:* Bill Anderson shared that the Endowment Fund holds around \$90,000. It is currently earning a 2% return.

*Parking Lot Restriping:* With the very positive reception by church members of the restriping mini-campaign, the Council gave approval to begin the job.

*Tithing:* The Council agreed to donate \$1000 each to the Pacific Lutheran Theological Seminary and Luther Seminary. ELC has had a strong relationship with both institutions.
